These Articles of Incorporation

The NATIONAL ENCAMPMENT OF THE LADIES AID SOCIETIES OF THE SONS OF VETERANS, UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

WITNESSETH, That we, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the State of Ohio, desiring to form a corporation, not for profit, under the general corporation laws of said State, do hereby certify

FIRST The name of said corporation shall be THE NATIONAL ENCAMPMENT OF THE LADIES AID SOCIETIES OF THE SONS OF VETERANS, UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

SECOND Said corporation shall be located, and its principal business transacted at Sidney in Shelby County, Ohio.

THIRD The purpose for which said corporation is formed is, not for profit, but for:

- First: To assist the Sons of Veterans in keeping green the memories of our soldiers, and their sacrifices for the maintenance of the Union.
- Second: To aid the members of the Grand Army of the Republic in caring for their helpless and disabled veterans; to extend aid and protection to their widows and orphans; to perpetuate the memory and history of their heroic deeds, and the proper observance of Memorial Day.
- Third: To aid and assist the Sons of Veterans in all their objects, both financially and otherwise.
- Fourth: To aid and assist worthy and needy members of our societies.
- Fifth: To inculcate true patriotism and love of country, not only among our membership, but all the people of our land, and to spread and sustain the doctrine of equal rights, universal liberty and justice to all.
- Sixth: To transact such business, appertaining to the order, as may come before it, and make such rules and regulations as are necessary to carry out the objects of the order.
