Credentials must be signed by your Auxiliary President and Secretary and stamped with the Auxiliary Seal. The Auxiliary President and Secretary must remember that only the sitting Auxiliary President or Vice President can vote at the National Encampment and each Auxiliary is entitled to only *one* Delegate and Alternate. Be sure credentials are properly filled out. No one will be permitted to register as a delegate without a credential.
