RECOMMENDATIONS ADOPTED AT THE SEVENTY-THIRD ANNUAL ENCAMPMENT RECOMMENDATIONS

From the National President's report:

- 1. That we set aside two pages in our proceedings with a photograph of each Past National President that has passed away this year.
- 2. That the Per Capita tax remain the same for the coming year.
- 3. That our National President in the future be allowed to purchase and place a wreath at the annual Service held at Lincoln's Tomb in Springfield, Illinois in the name of our National Organization. Cost of same not to exceed \$15.00.
- 4. That in the future our National President be allowed to purchase and place a wreath at the Altar of the Nation on Memorial Day in the name of the National Organization. Cost of same not to exceed \$15.00.

From the National Secretary's report:

1. That the "accordion fold" Roster be adopted for future use.

Committee on Badges:

- 1. That we accept the offer of Mr. Frank to have the cut of the 25 and 50 year pins put on paper so that pictures of these pins be sent to the Departments and individual Auxiliaries.
- 2. Gold and Silver charms bearing the insignia on the center of our badges are available at a cost of \$2.00 each; Lavaliers are available at \$13.50 each, plus 10% Federal tax. These items are to be advertized throughout our Organization, and each one sold will put a profit in the National Treasury. These are to be ordered direct from the National Treasurer.

Director of the Budget:

1. That the three savings accounts now in the name of the National Organization be closed and the National Treasurer be instructed to use this money to purchase 1,000 shares of Wellington Fund in the

- name of the National Organization, and all dividends be made payable in cash.
- 2. That the balance of the money from these three savings accounts, after the cost of the shares of stock is deducted, be placed in our general fund.
