<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Civil War education should include school presentations, information booths at reenactments or other events, educational talks, etc.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> Non-Civil War related school activities might include activities such as volunteering as a classroom aide, chaperone on field trips, painting, building or repair of school facilities or equipment, etc.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>4</sup> Gifts to Naturalization Courts can include American Flags and other patriotic items for new citizens.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>5</sup> Used cellular phones can be donated to domestic violence prevention groups to be used by victims in emergency situations.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>6</sup> Some charities accept soda tabs or box tops to raise money. Examples include the Ronald McDonald House and Kidney Foundations and Elks Clubs and some Schools.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>7</sup> Used greeting cards can be donated to schools and senior centers for use in craft projects.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>8</sup> Used stamps can be turned in to the Eastern Star.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>9</sup> The standard mileage rate for the cost of operating a car for charitable purposes is 14 cents per mile, as determined by the Internal Revenue Service.
