Trea\$urer Time

In this issue, with the National Encampment ahead of us, I would like to talk about the budget. Each year at the Encampment the Treasurer proposes a budget for the upcoming fiscal year. Based upon the floor discussion the proposed budget can be adjusted. Once the budget is to the satisfaction of the voting delegates it is approved by majority vote. The proposed budget presented is typically based upon the previous year's allocations and spending. Additionally, feedback provided from the President, Vice President, and the Council is considered. Last year's approved budget expenses were distributed as follows:

- Patriotic (Wreaths, Donations, Dues and Scholarships) 9 %
- Convention/Encampment (Site Committee and Officer Expenses) 24 %
- Communications (Printing, Postage, Web-Site) 32 %
- Operational (Office Supplies, Supplies for Auxiliaries, and National Officer Expenses) 35%

Income from per capita dues and supply sales, along with funds raised by the Patriotic Instructor and the Chief of Staff, were projected to satisfy the above expense categories. It is worth noting that Life Membership and Honor Roll receipts are not considered in the budget and are moved directly to our Permanent Fund (savings).

With all this said, my message to you today is that we are well on track this year to cover last year's approved budgeted expenses. Furthermore, next year I expect the same. I look forward to seeing you at our National Encampment to take part in the voting for the upcoming budget. Historian's Reflections

REHABILITATION

This is an excerpt from the Report of Rehabilitation Committee found in the 1950 Proceedings, presented by PNP Sister Edith B. Nile.

Day after day, all over our great nation, women are volunteering their services to Veteran Hospitals freely. They are giving their service in order to have a part in doing things for those who have done so much for America.

The services rendered by our Auxiliary members can be measured only in terms of heartwarming acts of comfort and kindness. Acts that are so important to the welfare of the hospitalized Veteran.

Our hospitals are overflowing with boys of other wars, and now we are engaged in the Korea combat where many of our American boys will lose their lives, and many will be hospitalized for life.

Rehabilitation service is important, and we should all give a generous amount of our time to this activity. The little things we do may seem so small as hardly meriting the giving of anything to them, but all these small things put together have made many a boy happy.

Records show a large percentage of the hospitalized boys have not been visited by family or friend in the past year. This is especially true in mental cases. Our activities in these hospitals, give Veterans the comforting assurance of deep interest in their welfare.

These words ring true sixty-five years later. Sadly, additional war veterans have been added. There is still a need to have a presence in caregiving at the hospitals to let these veterans know that we

care. Become involved, adopt a unit, collect items of nee-soapsocks-lotion, lip balm, sponsor a party, buy donuts, candy, bring cards. blankets-Be creative, they will love whatever donate-be vou active...



VOTING DELEGATES

Please reference the Constitution, Rules and Regulations for detailed information concerning voting delegates. Alternates will be seated as voting delegates as spots become available. Voting delegate status automatically goes to the following:

- 1. All Past National Presidents in good standing, and all sitting National Elected and Appointed Officers (except the National Personal Aide) in good standing.
- 2. All sitting and past Department Presidents in good standing. A Department may also send two (2) voting delegates.
- 3. All sitting Auxiliary Presidents and Auxiliary-at-Large Presidents in good standing, and one (1) voting delegate from each Auxiliary.
- 4. National Membership-at-Large delegate allotment is based on the total NMAL membership at the time of the Annual Per Capita Report.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENTS



MEMBERSHIP

Membership in Auxiliary to Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War can be obtained through eligibility in several ways:

- 1. Women who are lineal or collateral descendants, of soldiers, sailors or marines regularly mustered and honorably discharged from the Army, Navy, or Marine Corps of the United States of America during the War of the Rebellion 1861-1865. Daughter, granddaughter, granddaughter, niece, grandniece, etc., & legally adopted daughters qualify.
- 2. Mothers, wives, widows, daughters & legally adopted daughters of Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War in good standing. (Not Associates)
- 3. Associate Memberships: Available to women who do not qualify through heredity, #1 & #2 above, who demonstrate a genuine interest in the Civil War and can subscribe to the purpose and objects of the Auxiliary. An Associate may vote and hold any office except that of National Vice-President and National President. Associates may not exceed one-third of the total membership of the Auxiliary at the time of election.
- 4. Junior Membership: For young ladies of not less than six (6) years of age.
