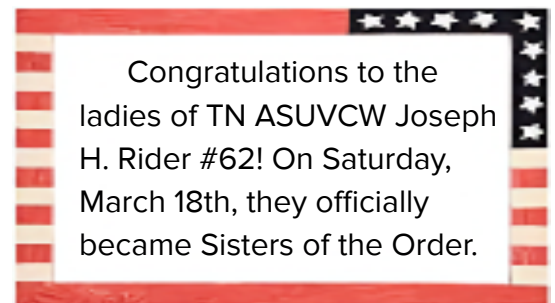

Keeping true to our history:

My search in our National History has not found another time in which the two money offices at the National Level were left vacant; no sister willing to step forward in earning the needed funds for our Order. (Thank you, Sister Kim Villalva, for recently stepping in as National Chief of Staff for this year after already serving a money-making position.)



These two positions are of great importance. Without the funds raised, the Order would not be able to function in its daily activities. The cost of doing business is not self-sustaining with only our annual dues.

The National Patriotic Instructor provides leadership in promoting patriotism both within our organization and to the general public, as well as raise funds applied towards memorial wreaths at the Lincoln Birthday Ceremony in D.C., Lincoln Tomb Ceremony in Springfield, IL, Grant’s Tomb in New York, Memorial Day at Arlington National Cemetery, VA, and Remembrance Day, Gettysburg, PA. The funds also cover the National Scholarship Fund, GAR Fund, and Patriotic Gift to an organization within the State of the National Convention.

The Chief of Staff raises funds for the National Auxiliary and assists with activities outside the business sessions at National. Funds are earned for general operating expenses of the National Organization.

Both positions require the ability to raise funds for the Auxiliary, communication with the membership and staff, keep accurate records of the funds and submit funds to the National Treasurer.

The money positions also serve the purpose of showcasing your abilities to organize, work with others, handle the Order’s funds, communicate with others and show your creativity. This is a stepping stone towards demonstrating your ability to lead- for becoming a National President. But this position can be held without aiming towards the National President position.

We can be creative in problem solving about the positions occasionally, but the membership must encourage our loyal sisters to move up in the organization and take action.

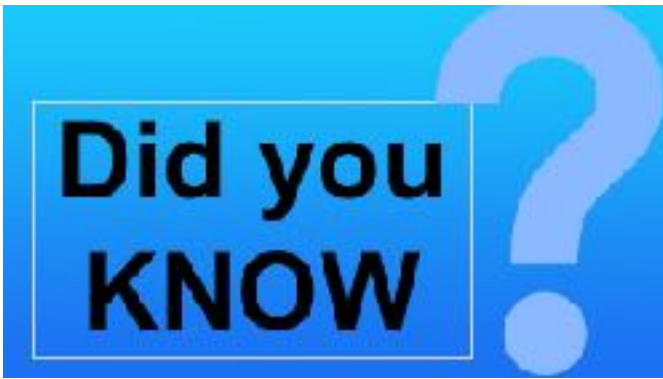

In this newsletter edition, I want to explain the role and capabilities of Auxiliaries at Large and Members at Large during a National Encampment. Often, a National Encampment may seem daunting or even confusing to anyone that does not have the ability to attend a formally structured Auxiliary/ Department meeting. Our Past National Presidents are typically gracious in sharing their wisdom and experiences with newcomers or those that do not understand the proceeding of the encampment, and

this has helped on so many occasions. But, let's give our Auxiliary at Large and Members at Large a little more background.

Auxiliary-at-Large: Our National Organization maintains a number of Auxiliaries that are not located in areas where a Department is present. A lack of a Department may be due to being in a more remote location or reduced membership within that area. Many Departments formed by expanding one Auxiliary into a minimum of three, the required number for the higher echelon to be proposed to the National level. Our organization currently has Auxiliaries-at-Large in Arizona, Illinois, Missouri, Oklahoma, Oregon, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas and Washington.

So how does an Auxiliary-at-Large make an impact at a National Encampment?

Well, all currently sitting At-Large Presidents (or Vice Presidents) receive a vote during the National Encampment. This is in addition to one delegate (or alternate) from each Auxiliary.

Member-at-Large: There are many Sisters within our organization that do not belong to a local Auxiliary but rather hold a role as a Member-at-Large. These members often choose this type of membership due to their own remote location or for personal reasons.

What can a Member-at-Large do at a National Encampment?

There is a meeting conducted prior to the start of the Encampment (typically on Thursday evening) where all Members-at-Large gather to discuss who will be a delegate for the National meeting. One delegate for every 20 Members-at-Large will be appointed with guidance from the National Membership-at-Large Coordinator during this meeting.

What else can these members do? Any member in good standing who meets all the requirements may be elected to any National Office. Each office has its own requirements, though most simply request that members demonstrate experience and knowledge prior to running for office. There may be some difficulty when considering a candidate for the office of National President or National Vice President as these candidates must be a Past President of a Department. However, it is not an impossible task.

What is Trinity Sunday? Trinity Sunday is the first Sunday after Pentecost to honor the Holy Trinity—the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This year it falls on June 4, 2023. The Holy Trinity is the term used to denote that God, Who is one unique being, exists as Three Persons, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, distinct from one another.

Although the word “Trinity” does not appear in Scripture, it is taught in: Matthew 28:18-20 ¹⁸ *“Then Jesus came to them and said, ‘All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.*

¹⁹ *Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,* ²⁰ *and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age.”* (New International Version: NIV); 2 Corinthians 13:14 *“May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.”* (NIV); and many other biblical passages.

Understanding of all scriptural doctrine is by faith which comes through the work of the Holy Spirit; therefore, it is appropriate that this mystery is celebrated the first Sunday after Pentecost, when the outpouring of the Holy Spirit first occurred.

Trinity Sunday is the time to try to explain the clues written in Scripture to guide us to a fuller understanding of our triune God. The Father is God from the beginning as in John 1:1 *“In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.”* (NIV) Jesus revealed Himself as equal to the Father in John 10:30 *“I and the Father are one.”* Together, they sent the Holy Spirit as in John 14:26 *“But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you.”* (NIV). Matthew 28:19 also notes *“Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.”* (NIV)

On Trinity Sunday, the Christian Church contemplates with joy and thanksgiving what the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit have done and do to accomplish the salvation of errant humanity. It brings to remembrance how Christians should respond to the love that God shows us by praising Him and giving Him glory. We remember the Father as our Creator, the Son as our Savior, and the Holy Spirit as our Comforter, as the Lord and Giver of Life in the Nicene Creed, and the creator Spirit, present before the creation of the universe. Through His power everything was made in Jesus Christ, by God the Father. Scriptural readings for the Trinity Sunday ceremony often include Psalm 8, beginning and ending with, *“O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is Your name in all the earth.”* and 2 Corinthians 13:11 *“Finally, brothers and sisters, rejoice! Strive for full restoration, encourage one another, be of one mind, live in peace. And the God of love and peace will be with you.”* (NIV)

A Trinity Sunday Prayer: Almighty God, we praise you: Father all-powerful, Christ Lord and Savior, and Spirit of Love. You reveal yourself in the depths of our being, drawing us to share in your life and your love. One God, three Persons, be near to the people formed in your image, close to the world that your love brings to life. May the love of God, the grace of Lord Christ Jesus, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with us. We ask you this, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, one God, true and living, forever. Amen.

214TH CELEBRATION OF LINCOLN’S BIRTHDAY IN WASHINGTON D.C.

President Abraham Lincoln’s 214th Birthday was commemorated at the iconic Lincoln Memorial in Washington D.C. on 12 February 2023. Members of the Auxiliary to Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War (ASUVCW) along with other Allied Orders of the Grand Army of the Republic and other organizations braved the chilly, damp weather to celebrate this event inside the monument’s walls. Representatives from the ASUVCW included National President Allison Pollitt (who presented the wreath for the ASUVCW), National Chaplain and Liaison for Washington D.C. Activities Rosemary Martin, Liaison to the National Encampment Host Committee, Anna Frail, and Department of the Chesapeake President Denise Thompson. All were able to participate and enjoy the celebration hosted by the Lincoln Birthday National Commemorative Committee. Mr. John Moore acted as the Master of Ceremonies, while National Park Service members assisted with the set up and instructing the wreath layers during the ceremony. The Allied Orders were represented by National President Beth Null (LGAR), National President Lynne Dolan (DUVCW), National President Allison Pollitt (ASUVCW), and Commander-in-Chief Bruce Frail (SUVCW).

The program consisted of a Tribute to Abraham Lincoln including a Musical Prelude by the U. S. Air Force Band Brass Quintet, an Introduction, Presentation and Retirement of Colors by the Joint Armed Forces Color Guard, The National Anthem and Pledge of Allegiance, Invocation, Remarks, Reading of “The Gettysburg Address,” a History Award, “The Battle Hymn of the Republic,” a beautifully sung Musical Interlude, Wreath Presentations, Benediction, the Sounding of Taps, and a Musical Postlude.

USS KEARSARGE

USS Kearsarge is best known for her defeat of the Confederate commerce raider CSS Alabama off Cherbourg, France during the American Civil War. The battle between Kearsarge and Alabama is commemorated by the United States Navy with a battle star on the Civil War campaign streamer. In addition, 17 of Kearsarge's crew received the Medal of Honor for valor during this action.

Kearsarge was the only ship of the United States Navy named for Mount Kearsarge in New Hampshire. Subsequent ships were later named Kearsarge in honor of the ship.

The Department of New Hampshire of the Sons and Auxiliary are pleased to present this beautiful 2023 commemorative encampment badge to honor the legendary USS KEARSARGE.

There will only be 150 badges made. Now is your chance to own this unique collector's item. The medal depicts the battle between the USS KEARSARGE and the CSS ALABAMA with "KEARSARGE & ALABAMA" at the top and Cherbourg June 19, 1864 at the bottom. The anchor and line give it a nautical theme.
