Those wishing to receive a paper copy may contact their Department or Auxiliary at Large for assistance in printing. This will greatly reduce the expenses incurred for printing and shipping by the National Organization.

As we look towards closing out 2022, it is my intention to continue to provide open communication among all echelons within the Auxiliary. I will again be hosting quarterly National Officer meetings online, as well as quarterly Department President/Auxiliary at Large President meetings. Attendance is highly encouraged. Additionally, I ask that all Presidents verify contact information with the National Secretary to ensure our roster is correct.

#### LIFE MEMBERSHIP


Consider a Life Membership for yourself or someone else! After making a one-time payment, a Sister may become a Life Member. She will remain a member of her local Auxiliary and may provide any additional support she deems fit, but will never be subject to per capita dues again. The cost for Life Membership is as follows:

Under Age 50 = \$350.00 Age 50 - 64 = \$250.00

Age 65 - 84 = \$200.00

Age 85 and above = FREE

May you experience the happiness of gift giving and create or expand a tradition of care throughout your community.



# SUMMARY OF ACTIONS AT THE NATIONAL ENCAMPMENT

## GRAND RAPIDS, MI AUGUST 12-13, 2022 From the notes of the National Secretary

- 1. That PNP Denise Oman be reimbursed for her travel expenses in the amount of \$3,500 that had not been paid previously. **Passed**
- 2. That the Life Membership fee received in 2021 be transferred to a separate line item in the Budget to pay for future Life Membership costs. **Passed**

#### PENNSYLVANIA DEPARTMENT

3. Recommendation to change Regulations Chapter I, Article II Membership, Section 8: Dual Membership is permitted with the person entitled to the rights and privileges accorded all members. National Per Capita Dues shall only be collected on Sisters from their Primary Auxiliary. Should a Sister be a Dual Member in two different Departments, both Auxiliaries shall be responsible for the State Per Capita Dues in their respective Departments. These Auxiliaries may charge the Dual Member dues, however, the Dual Member will not pay the Five Dollar (\$5.00) application fee when being accepted as a member in another Auxiliary. **Passed** 

#### NATIONAL PATRIOTIC INSTRUCTOR

4. That when the National Patriotic Instructor reaches the fundraising goal of \$2,000 and exceeds it by \$100 or over, that the additional funds be split 50/50 with the National ASUVCW and the chosen Charity. **Failed** 

#### **NATIONAL GRAVES REGISTRATION OFFICER**

- 5. Adopt a National Graves Registration Officer Job Description. Failed
- 6. Create a National Auxiliary Graves Registration Committee. Failed
- 7. That a Department may establish a Graves Registration Officer and encourage members at Auxiliary level to support that position. **Passed** 
  - 8. That the National Graves Registration Officer be a 3-year appointed position. Passed

#### NATIONAL PROGRAM COORDINATOR FOR FEMALE VETERANS INFORMATION

9. That the position of National Auxiliary Female Veteran Liaison Officer become a 5-year permanent appointed position. **Passed** 

#### **NATIONAL SUPPLY OFFICER**

- 10. That we research the possibility of using PayPal for direct deposits and collection of shipping costs, saving us postage expenses. **Failed**
- 11. That the Supply Officer be provided \$150.00 and that amount maintained throughout the year for shipping and expenses. **Passed**
- 12. That the pictures of the supply list items be available on the website, Facebook, etc. for viewing by the membership. **Passed last year, tabled until next year**

#### NATIONAL SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON CREATION OF INSPECTOR GENERAL

13. That the Article IV Discipline Section have sections 4-7 removed and replaced with new Sections 4-10 that creates a timeline for how a complaint is handled. **Passed** 

#### **NATIONAL PERSONAL AIDE**

14. That the National President's Travel Reimbursement be increased to \$4,000. Committee recommended a higher amount. Travel Reimbursement for the National President raised to \$5,000.

#### CR&R

15. Regulations, Subordinate Auxiliaries, Article VII Meetings – Add Section 6. Hybrid meetings will be permitted to include in-person and teleconference.

#### **COMMITTEE ON COMMITTEE REPORTS**

16. That the Per Capita Dues be increased to \$15.00 per year beginning 2023.

September 17, 2022 Sharpsburg, Maryland. The Department of the Chesapeake Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War (SUVCW) and Auxiliary to Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War (ASUVCW) as well as a member of the Daughters of Union Veterans of the Civil War gathered to commemorate the 160th Anniversary of the Battle of Antietam. They met at the North Woods on the Antietam Battlefield, near the Clara Barton Monument.

Approximately 22,720 soldiers were killed, wounded, or missing at the Battle of Antietam. There has never been another single-day battle in the history of the United States



This was the first time the SUVCW was able to participate in the procession, in which it was stated by the Mayor that the SUVCW now has a forever spot in the procession because they now know the SUVCW are the heirs to the GAR. Holding the banner are members of the JROTC, in which the Camp provides scholarships for. The Picacho Peak Camp #1 SUVCW of Phoenix failed to participate in any Memorial Day ceremonies in unison.





Picacho Peak Auxiliary #1 of Phoenix, Arizona President Verna Maleski visited the statue of Buckey O'Neill in Prescott, Arizona. Buckey who was a famous Rough Rider in the Spanish American War was also a famous sheriff within Arizona. While charging up San Juan Hill in Cuba he was shot in the face by a Spanish Bullet. He was buried where he fell and was later exhumed and buried in Arlington. His wife Pauline O'Neill was the 1st woman legislator in Arizona and fought for women's and children's rights. We in Arizona remember the Rough Riders and the Veterans of the Spanish American War as they hailed from this area and that the Spanish American War is the only war where veterans of the Civil War participated together. Like the speech in their send off to Cuba from Arizona said "we go as the blue and the gray a United band".
