AUXILIARY TO SONS OF UNION VETERANS OF THE CIVIL WAR

Passing of Past Commander-in-Chief Richard Greenwalt

By the authority vested in me as National President of the Auxiliary to Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, and the National Constitution, Rules and Regulations, it is hereby ordered as follows:

Section 1: It is my sad duty to report the death of Past Commander-in-Chief of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War Richard L. Greenwalt on April 6, 2015 at the age of 87.

Section 2: Richard Lee “Dick” Greenwalt’s grandfather Peter R. Greenwalt served in Company I, 10th West Virginia Infantry.

Section 3: Brother Greenwalt joined McClellan Camp No. 91, SUVCW in Alliance, Ohio in 1965. He was elected Camp Commander in 1967, Commander of the Department of Ohio in 1968, and Commander of the Central Region Association of the Allied Orders of the Grand Army of the Republic in 1973. He was elected Commander-in-Chief at the 97th Annual National Encampment held in Grand Rapids, Michigan on August 13-17, 1978 and was the most senior living Past Commander-in-Chief.

Section 4: Brother Greenwalt leaves many relatives who are members of the Allied Orders. Condolences may be sent to his widow Beatrice Greenwalt at 2276 County Road 139, Ovid, NY 14521, or to his daughter Nancy Greenwalt Hilton at 1576 Charl Ann Drive, Alliance, OH 44601.

Section 5: There will be a viewing with Masonic and SUVCW services on April 12, 2015 from 4:00 PM to 7:00 PM at Cassaday-Turkle-Christian Funeral Home, 75 South Union Avenue in Alliance, Ohio. The funeral will take place at the same location on April 13, 2015 at 10:00 AM, with interment to follow at Locust Hill Cemetery in Chester, West Virginia at 2:30 PM.

Section 6: The Auxiliary to Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War extends its sincere condolences to Brother Greenwalt’s family and friends, and to the Brothers of the SUVCW.

The foregoing General Order is proclaimed this 8th day of April in the year of our Lord two thousand fifteen, and of the Independence of the United States of America the two hundred thirty-ninth, in the City of Gilroy, County of Santa Clara, State of California.
