

SPECIAL GENERAL ORDER NO. 1 SERIES 2017-2018 Auxiliary to Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War

Passing of Real Daughter Maggie Johnson Devane

By the authority vested in me as National President of the Auxiliary to Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, and the National Constitution, Rules and Regulations, it is hereby ordered as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>: It is with deepest regret that I report the death of Real Daughter Maggie Johnson Devane of St. Pauls, North Carolina on September 12, 2017 at the age of 111 years.

Section 2: Maggie was the daughter of a former slave, Pvt. Henry Clay Johnson of Company H, 135th United States Colored Infantry, and his third wife, Nannie Bell Montgomery.

<u>Section 3</u>: Maggie is survived by her son, Gene Devane, three grandsons and a niece, Doris Bonds. She was preceded in death by her husband, Junious Devane, and a sister, Inez Womack.

<u>Section 4</u>: The Auxiliary to Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War extends its sincere condolences to Maggie's family and friends.

Section 5: All Charters are to be draped in black for a period of thirty (30) days.

<u>Section 6</u>: All Sisters are respectfully directed to attach a black mourning ribbon to their membership badge for a period of thirty (30) days.

The foregoing Special General Order is proclaimed this twenty-second day of December, in the year of our Lord two thousand seventeen, and of the Independence of the United States of America the two hundred and forty-second, in the city of Alliance, County of Stark, State of Ohio.
