VOTING DELEGATES

Please reference the Constitution, Rules and Regulations for detailed information concerning voting delegates.

Alternates will be seated as voting delegates as spots become available.

The voting membership of the National Encampment shall be Sisters in good standing, as follows:

1. All elective National Officers and the National Chief of Staff; Past National Presidents;

2. Past National Secretaries; Past National Treasurers;

3. Sitting Department Presidents; Past Department Presidents; Department Secretaries or Department Treasurers having been conferred Past Department President honors for serving five (5) or more consecutive years;

4. Sitting Auxiliary Presidents; Sitting Auxiliary at Large Presidents;

5. Two (2) Delegates or Alternates from each Department; (1) Delegate for each twenty (20) members or major fraction thereof from Membership at Large, to be appointed by the National Secretary. Each voting member shall pay a registration fee to attend the National Encampment.

NATIONAL OFFICERS AND COMMITTEE CHAIRS

If you will not be able to attend the National Encampment, please send a copy of your report to National Secretary Rachelle Campbell

before July 30th. If you will be attending the National Encampment, please be prepared to read a summary of your report, and have two (2) copies of your full-length report to be submitted to the National Secretary and the Encampment Committee on Officer Reports. Please try to keep your oral summary report to approximately five (5) minutes or less.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENTS

Each Department President should prepare a written summary of her Department's activities since the last National Encampment. If the Department President will be at the National Encampment she should be prepared to read a summary of her report and have two (2) copies of the full-length report for submission to the National Secretary. Please try to limit oral reports to two (2) minutes or less. If she is unable to attend, the Department President should submit her written report to National Secretary Rachelle Campbell at or before the National Encampment, for inclusion in the National Proceedings.

Reminder: Get all endorsements for National Officer Candidates and any Recommendations in by July 30.



Historian's Reflections

FRATERNITY, CHARITY, LOYALTY

These three simple words defined the principles of the Grand Army of the Republic. These three words served as their motto. Hearing these three words, kindled the spirit of greatness and was breathed into the Allied Orders by inheritance.

FRATERNITY refers to the brotherhood our Civil War ancestors felt toward the men with whom they served. It was because of the great dedication of their patriotism that we set aside days of remembrance to perpetuate their heroic deeds, sacrifices, and the preservation of our nation – especially Memorial Day, Lincoln's Birthday, Lincoln's Death Day, and Appomattox Day.

CHARITY refers to The Grand Army of the Republic adopting their principles from President Lincoln's second inaugural address, "to bind up the Nation's wounds, and to care for him who shall have borne the battle, and for his widow and orphan." The many works our members do to ensure the principles of caring for the needy veteran, widow, and family members are addressed as well as keeping the memory of our Civil War veterans true through teaching U.S. Civil War history, marking, decorating, and maintaining Civil War headstones, monuments and battle sites.

LOYALTY refers to being loyal to the United States Constitution and its flag.

Those three words offer each of us the opportunity to participate in our Order to conduct the many needed services of our nation in the name of our organization. How have you participated in this venture? Have you visited a veteran, dropped off personal items at a Veterans Administration hospital, cleaned a cemetery, laid a wreath at a veteran's grave, maintained a Civil War monument, fed a homeless veteran and his or her family, mailed in coupons for soldiers to use while serving, created a quilt, blanket, pillow case, or care package to send to a serving soldier? Have you come up with other ideas and acted upon them? Have you helped our National Patriotic Instructor and Chief of Staff raise money this year? They have an incredible task of earning thousands, not hundreds of dollars, to support our organization. Through the years, our Sisters have stepped up and have been counted on to aid both the Order and our needy veteran. As a member, what will be your legacy?



A Word of Explanation regarding the SUVCW Eagle Scout certificates:

The rank of Eagle Scout may be earned by a Scout who has been a Life Scout for at least six months, has earned a minimum of 21 merit badges, has demonstrated Scout Spirit, and has demonstrated leadership within their troop, crew or ship. Additionally they must plan, develop, and lead a service project—the *Eagle Project*—that demonstrates both leadership and a commitment to duty. After all requirements are met, they must complete an Eagle Scout board of review.

On October 11, 2017, the Boy Scouts of America announced that in 2019, a program for older girls would begin to be available, enabling girls to earn the rank of Eagle Scout. Over 2.5 million Eagle Scout awards have been presented in total since 1912. In 2020, the first female Eagle Scouts were added to the Boy Scouts of America.

One of the many goals and purposes of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War is to reward young men (and now also women) who achieve the status of Eagle Scout with a special congratulatory letter and color *Certificate of Commendation*, suitable for framing. When possible, every effort is made by Camp and Department members to present the certificate to the Scout at his Court of Honor, usually wearing the uniform of our Order or a replica Civil War uniform.

Recently, Sister President Wanda Langdon received the following letter from Benjamin Harrison Camp #356:

Greetings Camp President Langdon



information detailing the service hours, projects, etc. for Casey Davidson, Nathan Hummel (Troop 233 Greenfield, IN), and Sienna Huther.



MEMBERSHIP

Membership in Auxiliary to Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War can be obtained through eligibility in several ways:

- 1. Women who are lineal or collateral descendants of soldiers, sailors, or marines regularly mustered and honorably discharged from the Army, Navy, or Marine Corps of the United States of America during the War of the Rebellion 1861-1865. Daughter, granddaughter, great-granddaughter, niece, grandniece, etc., & legally adopted daughters qualify.
- 2. Mothers, wives, widows, daughters, & legally adopted daughter of Auxiliary to Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War in good standing. (Not Associates)
- 3. Associate Memberships: Available to women who do not qualify through heredity, #1 above, who demonstrate a genuine interest in the Civil War and can subscribe to the purpose and objects of the Auxiliary. An Associate may vote and hold any office except that of National Vice President and National President. Associates may not exceed one-third of the total membership of the Auxiliary at the time of election.
- 4. Junior Membership: For young ladies of not less than six (6) years of age.
